The Ukrainian Museum and Library of Stamford is the oldest cultural institution established by Ukrainians in North America. Here you can learn about the richness of Ukrainian culture and heritage, about the Ukrainian ethnic community in the United States.

The Museum’s holdings include more than 7,000 folk artifacts; close to 3,000 paintings and sculptures; and over 500 religious items, such as icons, hand crosses, vestments, and various church vessels.

The Ukrainian Research and Cultural Center has a unique collection of Ukrainica, i.e., a collection of some 70,000 volumes devoted to all areas of Ukrainian ethnic studies and civilization; extensive archival, photographic, philatelic, numismatic, and recording; represents one of the largest collections of Eastern European holdings in North America. The Library's resources are available on OCLC (On-Line Catalogue).

All courses will be offered by our qualified faculty and renowned guest speakers. Come and discover the beauty of Ukrainian culture.
